**Galatians 6:7-10**

6:7 What does he mean “mock God”?

“You reap what you sow”

In what areas have you seen this true?

This is true because we live in a cause and effect universe.

Einstein, “Most incomprehensible thing is that it is comprehensible.”

Is this natural law, or supernatural intervention?

Do people want to reap good that they didn't sow?

Do people want NOT to reap bad that they DID sow?

What does this passage call this? (verse 7)

Do we always intend all consequences that come?

Since we can't see all ends, what should we do?

Do you always reap immediately?

What does this say about that? (verse 9)

Do you always reap as much as you sow?

6:8 How do people sow to their flesh?

How can we sow to the Spirit?

Look at what you're sowing, in every area of life.

Ask, "What will I reap from this?"

"Is that really what I want to reap?"

6:9 What can get us tired of doing good?

Do you ever get tired of doing good? What should we do then?

Imagine you are a parent. How do you teach this to your children?

Laws of the Harvest:

1. We reap only what has been sown.
2. We reap the same kind as we sow.
3. We reap in a different season than we sow.
4. We reap more than we sow.
5. We reap in proportion to what we sow.
6. We reap the full harvest of the good - only if we persevere.  
The evil comes to harvest on it's own.
7. We can't do anything about last year's harvest, but we can about this year's!
8. What you feed grows. What you starve dies.
